Andy originally trained in Respiratory Medicine but has worked for the last 30 years in pastoral ministry. After 13 years as senior pastor of Beeston Free Church in Nottingham he relocated to his native Glasgow to work as Director of the Pastors Training Course at Cornhill Scotland. The event takes place at Trinity Church on King Street from 9.30am to 4.30pm on Tuesday 26th March.
